FYI... The Jewish Community (IKG) Nuremberg is in possession of the so-called Stürmer or Streicher Library, a collection of approximately 10,000 books, robbed by the Nazis. Restitution of this library to its legal successors is a special concern for the Jewish Community. It can be viewed completely free - no registration is necessary.

FYI... Portugal, as a “neutral” country during World War II, became a safe-haven for more than 100,000 refugees, the vast majority of them Jewish. About 400 of them passed through the Porto Synagogue and were helped to escape to the Americas by Captain Arthur Barros Basto. The Refugees' Archive was found a few years ago, containing the names and basic information of the

people that came to this Synagogue looking for shelter. However, many of them changed their family name upon arrival across the Atlantic, making the job of looking for them a very difficult one. One of the purposes of the Comunidade Israelita do Porto (Jewish Community of Oporto) is to track down these survivors in order to “finish the story”: find out where they went, how did they rebuild their lives and if they remember the Captain himself? Doing this with the descendants of the survivors is equally important so the Community welcomes any information that can be provided.
