The guidebook is intended to be an educational tool and resource for professional and paraprofessional caregivers serving Holocaust Survivors and their children, the Second Generation, with the goals of educating clinicians about how post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) manifests itself at the end of life in Holocaust Survivors, and raising self-awareness of healthcare providers to their own comfort levels and to their own reactions when working with Holocaust Survivors. It can also be a valuable resource for Holocaust Survivor families facing these issues.

**FYI...** Jewish Family Services of Greenwich, CT is one of the first social services agencies in the U.S. to widen its therapeutic reach via its pioneering video **Online Support Group Project** (**OSGP**). The online video conversations are run by experienced, licensed social workers and offer the same supportive group dynamic as in-person gatherings. Children of Holocaust survivors are welcome to join this conversation. Members will be able connect with others to reduce isolation and create a caring community from their own home. The *OSGP* provides vital emotional support without sacrificing much-needed energy and travel time. Groups are available to those of any religious background and sliding scale fees are also available. The services are being provided using secure, state-of-the-art live video conferencing technology; anyone with a computer and Internet access can join an online video conversation.
